ROUNDABOUT SCULPTURE RFQ

BUDGET: **\$400,000**

Request For Qualifications

This commission opportunity begins with a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) that will expand to a Request for Proposals (RFP) for qualified semi-finalists. The City of Carmel is seeking a well-qualified artist or team to create a signature sculpture for a roundabout adjacent to the **Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10003** in Carmel, Indiana.



Promoting Civic Responsibility and Patriotism

Supporting Youth and Local Program in Communities across America

This roundabout sculpture will serve to honor, for all time, the sacrifice and service performed by our military men and women. There should be a lighting element to allow the work to be enjoyed both day and night. As a roundabout sculpture, it should engage viewers at a distance. For safety reasons, it should not attract or require up-close interaction.

Media

The sculpture should be made of highly durable, low-maintenance materials and fabricated with easy maintenance and Indiana weather in mind. Additionally, the artwork should be artfully illuminated at night. This artwork should become part of the area's visual identity over time.

Guidelines

Site plans of the street and roundabout with associated references are provided on the following pages to guide the artist. Commissioned artworks should positively engage the viewer and evoke the courage and service of all veterans.

A variety of themes to consider include:

- Pay Homage to America's Past and its Heros
- Community #stillserving
- Our Nation's Promise
- Partnership & Advocacy
- Veterans of Every Generation
- Education, Employment and Transition Assistance
- Key Legislation

This location will have plenty of natural light by day, however, the structure must be safely illuminated externally or from within, to provide an impactful viewing experience at night. Power to the site will be provided.

This roundabout sculpture provides an opportunity for viewing from several key street perspectives. It is essential that the artist attends to these varied frames of reference in the design, with consideration to height and breadth.

It is vital that the scale of the artwork be appropriate not only to the size of the roundabout, but also to the scale of the surrounding architecture. A street view of the roundabout and surrounding buildings is provided. Finally, the piece should be visually impactful when viewed by pedestrians and vehicular roundabout traffic onsite, as well as from a distance.

About the Commissioner

Named one of the best places in America to live and raise a family by Money Magazine, American City Business Journal, and Forbes, Carmel is a vibrant city - a place people are excited to call home. Its safe and attractive neighborhoods, exceptional schools, recently expanded cutting edge library, unique retail areas and arts and cultural opportunities make Carmel one of the fastest growing communities in the nation.

The City of Carmel is a welcoming community with a broad range of housing opportunities. It also has outstanding parks with the 5.2-mile Monon Greenway and Monon Community Center and outdoor water park. City Center includes the state-of-the-art Palladium concert hall at The Center for The Performing Arts; the Tarkington and The Studio Theater also provide entertainment options. The Arts & Design District focuses on the visual and design arts and is home to the Indiana Design Center. The VFW Post 10003, that this roundabout artwork honors, is an established and cherished part of the community.

The City has made a commitment to the arts and uses its artistic and cultural attractions as one of its powerful economic development tools. With more than 150 roundabouts currently constructed, many of them are enhanced with sculptures and landscaping.

Budget and Funding

The total budget for this artwork is **\$400,000**. This budget includes artist fees/expenses, final design, fabrication, foundation, installation costs, engineering costs, permit costs, and insurance costs. Qualifying artists will be interviewed prior to being invited to create a design proposal. Semi-finalists will receive an honorarium of **\$2,000** to develop and present a proposal.

Application Closing Date: February 1, 2024

Qualifications

Professional artists and teams of artists who have experience designing, managing and completing site-specific art commissions with a budget of approximately \$300,000 within the past five years are eligible; or those who can demonstrate equivalent skills and experience.

Selection Criteria

- Quality of work completed
- Artistic aesthetic
- Demonstrates the ability to work collaboratively with planning groups
- Demonstrates the ability to design a site-specific work



Artwork Images

In the "Images of Your Work" section of your application on CODAworx, please submit at least 3 and up to 5 different completed artworks or past commissions (composites are acceptable). For each completed artwork, you will be prompted to upload a single, main image and specify the title of the artwork, location, budget (USD), year completed, medium, and dimensions.

Images must be JPG or PNG file format with a minimum of 620px width, a maximum of 1500px, and maximum file size of 5MB.
